NOTING the "Order in Lieu of Indictment" in the Contempt Case of Dragomir Pećanac issued

confidentially by the Chamber on 21 September 2011 ("Order in Lieu of Indictment");

NOTING the "Warrant of Arrest and Order for Surrender" issued confidentially on 21 September

2011 directing the competent authorities of the Government of the Republic of Serbia to search for,

arrest, detain, and promptly surrender Dragomir Pećanac ("Accused") to the Tribunal;

CONSIDERING that the Accused was transferred to the seat of the Tribunal on 9 October 2011;

CONSIDERING that the initial appearance of the Accused will be held on 10 October 2011

pursuant to Rule 62 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal ("Rules");

PURSUANT TO Rule 64 of the Rules;

HEREBY ORDER the detention on remand of the Accused and instruct the Commanding Officer

of the United Nations Detention Unit in The Hague to detain the Accused until further order.
