DECISION ADVISING THE TRIBUNAL'S PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF SERBIA'S CONTINUED FAILURE TO COOPERATE WITH THE TRIBUNAL

TRIAL CHAMBER I of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("Tribunal");

NOTING the "Further Decision on Order in Lieu of Indictment", filed on 5 December 2014;

NOTING the warrants of arrest and orders for surrender in relation to Petar Jojić, Jovo Ostojić, and Vierica Radeta, filed on 19 January 2015 ("Arrest Warrants");

NOTING the Chamber's decision of 25 August 2015, in which it advised the President of the Tribunal that the lack of action by the Republic of Serbia ("Serbia") can only be interpreted as harbouring an unwillingness to execute the Arrest Warrants;²

NOTING that on 13 January 2016, the Chamber ordered Serbia to submit monthly reports outlining its efforts regarding the execution of the Arrest Warrants;³

NOTING that on 10 February 2016, the Chamber ordered that these reports be submitted every two weeks;⁴

NOTING the decision of 2 August 2016, in which the Chamber ordered Serbia to comply with its obligations under Article 29 of the Statue of the Tribunal and reminded Serbia of its obligation to submit bi-weekly reports;⁵

NOTING that no bi-weekly reports were received since 18 May 2016;⁶

CONSIDERING that Serbia has not executed the Arrest Warrants;

CONSIDERING that Serbia, in addition, has failed to comply with the Chamber's order to submit bi-weekly reports;
