**ORDER ON THE REGISTRY SUBMISSION PURSUANT TO
RULE 33(B)**

I, THEODOR MERON, President of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“Tribunal”);

NOTING the “Report/Warning To: The President of the ICTY” filed by Mr. Dejan Mirović, Legal Advisor to Mr. Vojislav Šešelj (“Šešelj”) on 13 February 2012, which states, *inter alia*, that the Registry of the Tribunal (“Registry”) has informed Šešelj that it will not cover travel and accommodation expenses for a planned visit to Šešelj by members of his legal team;


NOTING the “Registry Submission Pursuant to Rule 33(B) Regarding Travel of Vojislav Šešelj’s Defence Team” filed publicly with confidential annexes by the Registry on 14 February 2012 (“Registry Submission”);

CONSIDERING that it is in the interest of justice to allow Šešelj the opportunity to respond to the Registry Submission;

HEREBY ORDER that Šešelj has five days from the date of the receipt of the B/C/S translation of this Order or the date of the receipt of the B/C/S translation of the Registry Submission, whichever is later, to file a response, if any, to the Registry Submission, after which the Registry shall have five days to file a reply, if any, to Šešelj’s response.
