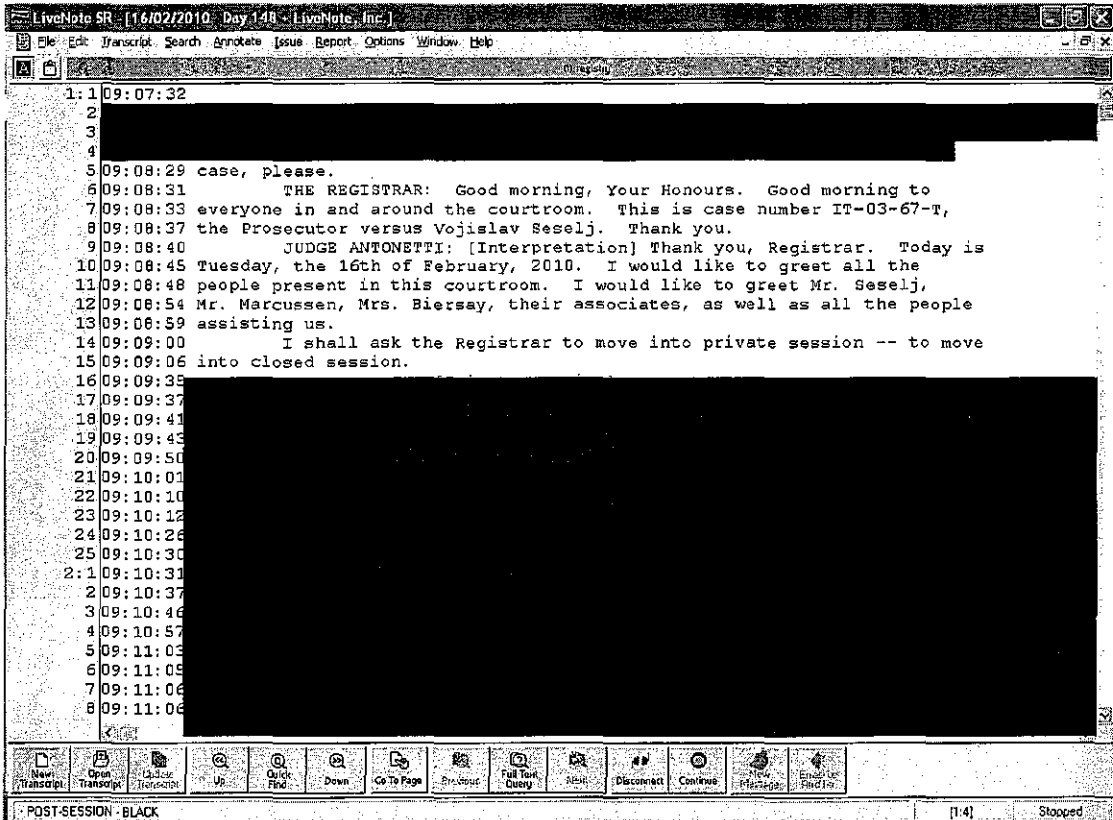

Amended Order to redact the public broadcast of a hearing

The Trial Chamber

ORDERS that the following blacked-out text be edited from the public broadcast of this hearing, dated 16 February 2010.

Amended Order to redact the public transcript and the public broadcast of a hearing

The Trial Chamber

ORDERS that the following blacked-out text, page 18 lines 16-18 (10.02.08-10.02.16) be omitted from the public transcript of this hearing and be edited from the public broadcast of this hearing, dated 16 February 2010.
